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TRAINING OVERVIEW

‘Localizing’ is the process of taking into account sub-national contexts in the achievement of the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Localization relates both to how the SDGs can provide a framework for local development policy and to how local and regional governments and other stakeholders can support the achievement of the SDGs through action from the bottom up. This ToT program will provide individuals with the knowledge, tools, methods and network for effectively putting into action the global goals at the national and sub-national level.

This Training of Trainers is structured for 4 days to meet the training objectives.

- Integrated Action Planning Process
- Creating shared vision and indicators
- Systems Mapping and identifying points of intervention

... start to put their thoughts together as individual trainers and change agents on how to apply the learning and tools from this ToT to their own work.

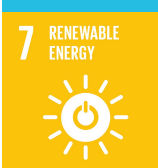


... have an opportunity to learn about local community efforts in Bangladesh in support of the SDGs and sustainable development;

... explain the **inter-linkages, synergies and potential trade-offs** between different SDGs and targets and implication for policy planning and programs development;



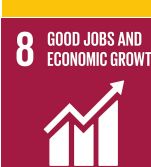
... apply a **multi-stakeholders collaborative action planning for localisation of the SDGs**.

... facilitate multi-stakeholder dialogue and practical activities on the SDGs for **training others**.



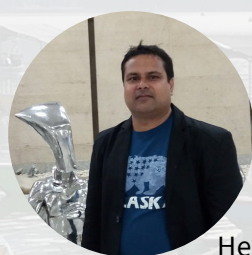
RESOURCE PERSONS
