Disruption caused by COVID 19 crisis


- no disruption for BE students as it coincides with 2-month summer holidays in Myanmar
- ☐ disruption of Teaching and Learning Methodology Training for new BE curriculum during summer
- ☐ disruption of first semester of HE &TVET students since 24.3.2020
- delay of University Entrance Selection
- ☐ delay of UDE Students Admission
- ☐ delay of Pre-service Primary Teacher Training (PPTT)



- developed Myanmar COVID 19 response and recovery plan for education sector, including impact of COVID-19 crisis on education (impact on access, quality, equity and management) in May
- ☐ managed to start University Entrance Process in June
- ☐ prepared reopening of new academic year for BE students level by level successfully, necessary health and safety in place and establishing preventive measures for schools in July







Preparation and Management

- ☐ Ensure no Learning loss, no discrimination, no one leaving behind, no school drop out
- ☐ Reduce contact, reduce crowds
- ☐ Support healthy and safety learning environment (Hand washing,

Mask and Face Shield, Physical Distancing, etc)








- Free Textbooks, Free Exercise Books, Free Ball Pens, Free Pencils
- Free Masks, Free Face Shield, Infrared Thermometer
- PPE for schools in highly affected COVID-19 pandemic townships
- Hand washing facilities, Toilets
- Physical Distancing (2 m) in classrooms
- Planning to reopen BE schools with 4 options:
 - 1. normal;
 - 2. shifts or alternating week;
 - 3. alternating week and 2 shifts;
 - 4. alternating week, 2 shifts and 3 days schooling but ensuring that learners do home assignments as well









- Wearing Mask, Face Shield
- Washing Hands systematically
- Physical Distancing (2)m
- Don't touch Mouth, Eye , Nose







- Established Temporary Learning Centres for IDPs
- Developed Standard Operating Procedures for Coming to School, Learning in Classroom, Lunch-time, Back to Home, School Bus
- Provided Teaching-Learning Methodology for New Textbooks Grade-4,
 7, 10 (on-line training and face-to-face 5 days training) and Health
 Awareness Training
- Held Meetings with Region and State Social Ministers, Members of Parliament, Region and State Education Officers
- Announced the Reopening of Schools in TV Talks, Newspaper Articles for Reopening School
- Identified School Enrolment Week in July
