

Competition for Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant Program (FLTA) For the academic year 2025-2026

GENERAL INFORMATION/ PROVISION

The Thailand – United States Educational Foundation (Fulbright) announces competition for the Fulbright Foreign Language Teaching Assistant Program (FLTA), a non-degree program sponsored by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs of the U.S. Department of State (ECA). The FLTA Program invites applications from young Thai teachers of English to refine their teaching skills, increase their English language proficiency and extend their knowledge of the cultures and customs of the United States while strengthening the instruction of foreign language at U.S. colleges and universities for nine months.

Fulbright FLTA participants may assist in **up to twenty hours of Thai language classes a week** and are required to enroll in **at least two courses per semester**, one of which must be in **U.S. Studies**. The remaining coursework must relate to their careers in English language teaching. Coursework is offered on either an audit or credit basis. Fulbright FLTA participants will also be expected to facilitate cultural events, language clubs, and language tables.

FLTA Program has a tremendous multiplier effect in the U.S. and in the home countries of the FLTA participants. U.S. universities benefit from the presence of a native foreign language speaker on their campuses. FLTA participants provide teaching assistance, by serving in various capacities. FLTA participants and U.S. students have the unique opportunity to learn about each other's culture and to build mutual understanding between the U.S. and other countries. FLTA participants also take courses in U.S. studies and in the teaching of English as a foreign language. Upon completion of the program, they return home, teaching English at their home countries with a high proficiency in English and are able to speak with authenticity and authority about the United States, its values and its people.

Selection will be based on the candidates' leadership skills, ability to motivate students to learn, and interest in teaching their native language and culture to U.S. students. Ideal candidates for the FLTA Program have a desire to meet people and become a part of their host community by participating in community events and campus activities. FLTA participants should also be creative and self-reliant team players, who are able to maintain excellent relationships with faculty, staff and students. FLTA Program is demand-driven and final selection is dependent on the ability to match the requests of U.S. host institutions with the language skills of the applicant pool.

Final selection and placement of Fulbright FLTA participants will be organized by the Institute of International Education (IIE) in the U.S.

Funding: All FLTA participants receive a monthly stipend, health insurance and travel support. Tuition waivers are also provided to support the required coursework.

IMPORTANT: This is a **non-degree** program. Any applicant who is seeking a U.S. degree should not apply for this Program.

Eligibility:

- be a Thai citizen in good health;
- be an English teacher at a Thai university or public secondary school (under OBEC), ideally early in your career. If you have over seven years of teaching experience, you will be considered on an individual basis;
- 3. obtain at least Bachelor's degree from Thai University or higher degree from a non-US institute;
- 4. preferable candidates who have little or no prior experience living in the United States;
- 5. be between at least 21 and no more than 35 years old by August 1, 2025;
- 6. be physically present in Thailand at the time of interview;

- 7. have a TOEFL score of no less than 79 (IBT) or 6.0 (Academic) IELTS, which valid for two years after the test date and not expire before October 1, 2025. (For TOEFL examination, please directly visit website www.toefl.org for more information)
- 8. must return to Thailand upon completion of the **nine-month program**. The Program will **NOT** support any extension requests for applicants; and
- 9. demonstrate maturity, dependability, integrity, and professionalism.
- 10. be disqualified if plagiarism is found in application.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Each applicant must create an online account on the online system at https://apply.iie.org/flta2025

- 1. An online application. The application is available from March 1- May 31, 2024 at 11.59 p.m.
- 2. Supporting documents through the online application portal:
 - a) PDF copies of official transcripts (in English version) for all degrees obtained.
 - b) PDF copies of diplomas (in English version) for all degrees obtained.
 - c) A PDF copy of valid TOEFL or IELTS score report
 - d) A resume/CV detailing work experience, education, skills, and other relevant activities.

3. Three recommendation letters

Through the online system, once you register your recommenders, they will receive an automatic email with instructions on completing the online recommendations. Recommendation letters should be submitted within the deadline of application.

The deadline for submitting the online application and relevant documents is Friday, May 31, 2024, at 11.59 p.m. (Thailand local time, GMT+7.00), to be eligible for consideration.
