1. Introduction

In November 2015, The Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO) will mark half-acentury of operations. As a regional inter-governmental organisation established among Southeast Asian countries, SEAMEO takes pride in its achievements over the years as Southeast Asian's leading organisation in promoting regional cooperation and human resource development in education, science and culture.

In response to the 2015 Southeast Asian community integration initiative, the development of partnerships and networking among schools and educational institutions across communities and countries is important to the aim of encouraging cooperation, the sharing of good practices, and exchanging teachers and students. The networking platform will also provide opportunities for teachers and students to understand cultural differences and leverage their necessary knowledge, skills and values to become global citizens and be more prepared for regional integration.

On the occasion of SEAMEO's 50th Year Anniversary, the SEAMEO Secretariat and the 21 SEAMEO Regional Centres and networks have jointly developed a networking platform of schools in Southeast Asian countries titled the **SEAMEO 50x3 Schools' Network**.

The network aims to serve as a "Network of Sharing and Development" between schools across Southeast Asia. The network consists of schools at three levels of education: primary, secondary, and vocational and technical schools.

The network aims to leverage the capacity of school leaders, teachers and students through capacity development programmes and other contributions from 21 SEAMEO Regional Centres, SEAMEO stakeholders, and partners. The network also provides opportunities for schools within the network to develop partnerships at the same, and across different educational levels.

For the year 2015, 50 primary schools, 50 secondary schools and 50 vocational and technical schools will be selected. At the end of 2015, it is expected that the SEAMEO 50x3 Schools' Network will be developed further and the number of participating school members expanded.

2. Definition of the SEAMEO 50x3 Schools' Network and its objectives

- The network is primarily a networking platform to promote and encourage partnerships and collaboration among schools in Southeast Asian countries, namely, Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Timor-Leste and Vietnam.
- The network consists of schools at three levels of education; primary, secondary, and vocational and technical schools.
- In the initial year of establishment in 2015, the network will select 50 primary schools, 50 secondary schools and 50 vocational and technical schools from 11 Southeast Asian nations.
- The network aims to leverage the capacity of school leaders, teachers and students in participating schools through specialised capacity development programmes and other resource contributions from 21 SEAMEO Regional Centres, SEAMEO stakeholders, and SEAMEO partners.
- The network aims to provide opportunities for participating schools to develop partnerships, share good practices, and exchange teachers and students within the network.

3. Participating Schools

- We invite all public and private primary, secondary, and vocational and technical schools in 11
 Southeast Asian countries, namely, Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia,
 Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Timor-Leste and Vietnam to submit an application form.
 (Please refer to the Application Guidelines as in point 5)
- The schools should demonstrate the following attributes (Please refer to the details in selection criteria as in point 6.):
 - School leaders, teachers and students have the potential to participate in capacity development programmes conducted by 21 SEAMEO Regional Centres and Networks.
 - Schools have policies and the aspiration to develop partnerships with other schools.

4. Benefits for Schools that Participate in the SEAMEO 50x3 Schools' Network

Schools selected to join the network will gain unique and beneficial opportunities to participate in a wealth of enlightening and innovative educational programmes designed and conducted by 21 SEAMEO Regional Centres, SEAMEO stakeholders and partners.

Opportunities for school development programmes

- This includes an invitation to participate in SEAMEO regional initiatives such as: Schools Nutrition Development Programmes; the SEAMEO Schools' Fit Programme; the Health Promotion Programme; Digital Learning in Southeast Asia; and Internationalisation and Harmonisation of TVET in Southeast Asia.
- Schools will also get an invitation to participate in various SEAMEO regional competitions and award schemes for schools and their teachers.

Opportunities for school leaders and teacher development programmes

- An invitation to participate in training courses, workshops and seminars that cover various educational development topics conducted by SEAMEO Regional Centres.
- An invitation to participate in various on-line/mobile training courses aimed at improving teaching and learning strategies.
- An invitation to participate in training courses on teaching and learning resource development.

Opportunities for student development programmes

- An invitation to participate in SEAMEO regional competitions and award schemes for students.
- An invitation to join on-line and mobile training courses designed to develop 21st century skills for students.

Opportunities for improving teaching and learning resources

 Participating schools will receive teaching and learning materials produced by SEAMEO Regional Centres and SEAMEO partners.

Opportunities to receive scholarships and grants

- These grants will enable schools to implement school-based development programmes.
- Some scholarships for disadvantaged/poor students will be provided by SEAMEO Centres and partners. (The contributors will select schools by considering location, policies, and needs of the schools.)

Opportunities to receive news about activities and programmes in SEAMEO centres

 Schools within the network will receive information about ongoing SEAMEO programmes, training courses and activities that cover various topics within the fields of education, science and culture.

- Opportunities to develop partnerships, exchange teachers and students, and share good practices with other schools.
 - The network will give participating schools unique opportunities to share information on requested partnership areas and contact details in order to facilitate greater partnerships and collaboration across the whole of Southeast Asia.
 - A group communication platform through on-line platforms will be developed to help the exchange of information and partnerships.

The assessment and evaluation of application forms will be conducted by the selection committee which consists of experts and representatives from SEAMEO Regional Centres.

For the year 2015, only 50 primary schools, 50 secondary schools and 50 vocational and technical schools will be selected. The selection criteria are as follows:

- Primary, secondary, and vocational and technical school, located in 11 Southeast Asian countries, namely: Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Timor-Leste and Vietnam
- English ability of teachers to participate in SEAMEO training programmes
- Basic capacity of ICT and Internet access at the school
- Strong interest and willingness indicators:
 - The school leader has clearly expressed an interest to participate in this SEAMEO network.
 - The school leader has provided clear relevant expectations for joining in this network.
- Clear policy and operational plan on partnerships with other schools in different communities or countries
- Strong community participation and linkages the school has clearly demonstrated communitybased activities.







1. Introduction

The angklung is a musical instrument made of two to four bamboo tubes suspended in a bamboo frame and bound with rattan cords. The tubes are carefully whittled (carved with small incisions) and cut by a master craftsperson to produce certain notes when the bamboo frame is shaken or tapped. Each Angklung produces a single note or chord, so several players must collaborate in order to play melodies.⁽¹⁾

It is one of the most popular and common musical instruments found across Southeast Asia. It originated in what is now the West Java and Banten provinces of Indonesia and it has been played for many centuries. In 2010, UNESCO officially recognized the Indonesian angklung as a "Masterpiece of [the] Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity". [2]









Angklung Ensembles

The angklung is a unique musical instrument in the Southeast Asian region and playing it in an orchestra setting requires skilled cooperation and coordination among musicians. Playing this instrument promotes values of teamwork, discipline, responsibility, mutual respect, concentration, the development of imagination and memory, as well as artistic and musical feelings. (1) Many schools in Southeast Asian countries have included the angklung as part of their musical curriculum and co-curricular activities in order to promote the aforementioned skills and to develop the values of students.

On the special occasion of the 50th Anniversary of SEAMEO, the SEAMEO Secretariat in collaboration with the SEAMEO Regional Open Learning Centre (SEAMEO SEAMOLEC), Indonesia have jointly organised a regional musical contest titled the "SEAMEO Song Angklung Contest".

2. Objectives of the Contest

The contest aims to:

- Celebrate the SEAMEO 50th Anniversary by promoting the Southeast Asian identity and appreciation
 of cultural heritage through a common and unique musical instrument in Southeast Asia, called
 "Angklung"
- 2) Promote the necessary values and skills of Southeast Asian students such as cooperation, harmonisation, responsibility and creativity which will better equip them for 21st century challenges and ASEAN integration.
- Enhance digital learning and the ICT skills of students by utilising mobile technology and learning how to produce a video.

3. All primary and secondary schools in Southeast Asia are invited to participate.

All primary and secondary schools in 11 Southeast Asian countries – namely Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Timor-Leste and Vietnam – are invited to participate in this contest.

4. Contest Categories

The school is free to choose the category in which they would like to participate. The contest consists of two categories:

A traditional angklung performance, and;



2) A digital angklung performance through the use of an android smart phone.

- 6) For the digital angklung performance, the school has to download the "digital angklung application" for the android smart phone from Google play. The Angklung application example can be found by typing the search term "Sundanese Instrument" in Google play.
- 7) Each category must include two songs: 1) The SEAMEO Song ("Building the Future, the SEAMEO Legacy"); and 2) an International/local popular song of their own choice.
- 8) Each performance of both categories should consist of a maximum 25 persons which can be mixed with different educational levels/ages of student. The 25 persons should include the players of two (2) other local musical instruments such as the drum, gong, xylophone, flute, etc. The school is free to choose two other local musical instruments.
- 9) A vocal sound/singer is optional.

- 10) The length of the video clip should be a maximum of 3.5 minutes per song, or 7 minutes in total (2 songs).
 - A short introduction of the group/school must be included in the video clip. This should be no longer than 15 seconds in duration. The introduction of the performance should include the school's logo, school name, country, and the SAMEO 50th anniversary logo.

The <u>SEAMED 50th Anniversary Logo</u> can be downloaded from the website: www.seameo.org or it can be requested by sending an email to angklungcontest@seameo.org

11) Requirements of the video file:

- The video file must be submitted in mp 4 format only.
- Each video file should NOT exceed 100 megabytes (100 MB) in size. The resolution of each file should be at least 480p (640 X 480 pixel for 4:3 ratio, and 854 X 480 pixel for 16:9 ratio)
- For best viewing experience, it is recommended to use 16:9 ratio while producing the video.

9. How to Submit the Video Clips

Schools can submit video clips for both categories to the SEAMEO Secretariat by the following two ways:

- 1) <u>Email:</u> Submit the completed **entry form** with a Dropbox or Google video clip download link sent to the following email address: angklungcontest@seameo.org
- 2) Postal Service: Submit video clips by sending a compact disc (CD) or handy drive together with the completed entry form to the SEAMEO Secretariat by post. Please protect the CD from damage by wrapping it in bubble wrap. The printed version of the completed entry form should be included in the package.
